
Hope all are doing well and, by the time you have read this, have received your COVID vaccinations.

Remembering Brig Gen (Ret) Chuck Yeager after his passing on 7 Dec 21, Class Webmaster Craig


MacPherson, CS-39, sent the wonderful photo below of Gen Yeager with several class wives and noted,
