 - Bill and Bob did a planning meeting with the AOG in December. Bob will be gathering volunteers starting in late March. In brief, here's the plan. We need to cover 40 swearing ins at 10 sites on the Academy throughout the day prior to graduation. The USAFA's lead for this is the AOC for CS-34, LtCol Dale Gogon, who we've already chatted with. We will get the schedule from him in mid-April, we will populate each ceremony with at least one '73 volunteer. . Each squadron will have a cadet POC, an AOC, and at least one AMT to work with.
